WHEREAS, 229 railway crossing and trespassing incidents occurred in Canada in 2023; resulting in 66 avoidable fatalities and 39 avoidable serious injuries; WHEREAS, educating and informing the public about rail safety (reminding the public that railway rights-of-way are private property, enhancing public awareness of the dangers associated with highway rail grade crossings, ensuring pedestrians and motorists are looking and listening while near railways, and obeying established traffic laws) will reduce the number of avoidable fatalities and injuries cause by incidents involving trains and citizens; and

WHEREAS Operation Lifesaver is a public/private partnership whose aim is to work with the public, rail industry, governments, police services, media and others to raise rail safety awareness;

WHEREAS CN and Operation Lifesaver have requested Town Council adopt this resolution in support of its ongoing efforts to raise awareness, save lives and prevent injuries in communities, including our municipality;

Therefore Council of the Town of Parry Sound hereby resolves to support national Rail Safety Week to be held from September 23 to 29, 2024.

licensing;

Now Therefore the Council of the Town of Parry Sound hereby resolves that Resolution 2024 - 099 be circulated to the West Parry Sound area municipalities, and to the Parry Sound Area Chamber of Commerce with a request for support and further circulation to relevant associations for support.

9.5.3 Declaration of Intimate Partner Violence an Epidemic

**Resolution 2024** 

Whereas Town of Parry Sound Council, on December 19, 2023 passed Resolution 2023-190 which supported the North Bay Parry Sound District Health Unit Board's call upon the Province of Ontario to: a) invest in surveillance and analytical methodologies to gain a better understanding of the prevalence of Intimate Partner Violence (IPV); b) develop a Provincial IPV strategy; and c) increase funding for the Healthy Babies Healthy Children Home Visiting program wherein staff respond to disclosure of Intimate

Partner Violence; and

Whereas the first of 86 recommendations released on June 28, 2022 by the Coroner's Jury serving on the inquest of the September 2, 2015 deaths of Carol Culleton, Anastasia Kuzyk and Nathalie Warmerdam in Renfrew County, calls upon the Government of Ontario to formally declare intimate partner violence as an epidemic;

and

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Whereas since the release of said Coroner's Jury recommendations, more than 100 municipalities, police services boards and service providers across the province are declaring intimate partner violence as an epidemic; and

Whereas Bill 173, Intimate Partner Violence Epidemic Act, 2024, introduced in the Ontario Legislature on March 7, 2024 which would recognize that intimate partner violence is an epidemic in Ontario, has not yet passed, being referred to the Standing Committee on Justice Policy;

Now Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Parry Sound hereby joins with the over 100 municipalities, polices services boards, and service providers across the province in declaring Intimate Partner Violence as an epidemic, and urges the province to immediately pass Bill 173, Intimate Partner Epidemic Act, 2024; and

That copies of this Resolution be forwarded to The Honourable Doug Ford, Premier of Ontario; Lorne Coe, Chair of the Standing Committee on Justice Policy; The Honourable Sylvia Jones, Minister of Health; Marit Stiles, Leader of Official Opposition; Honourable Graydon Smith, MPP Parry Sound-Muskoka and the Association of Municipalities of Ontario.

**Subject:** Active Transportation - Safer Streets -letter of recognition and encouragement

This letter is addressed to Mayor Jamie McGarvey, Mike Kearns- director of public works and the municipal councilors,

Regarding my previous communication and request on July 1st to the Director of Public Works to complete an investigation on Bowes, Church and Joseph Streets, I would like to thank the work of the office of Public Works to install center lane flex posts on Joseph Street and the speed cameras near the medical clinic on Bowes street. These small incremental changes do help. I am not sure if my request for the investigation was a factor in having these installed, or if it is just coincidental, but I will take this as an optimistic sign that the municipality is committed to pedestrian and biking safety.

Incremental and rapid changes are fine, but we will see the greatest benefit once there is a connected network of active transportation infrastructure (like protected sidewalks and bike lanes) to all the parks, the grocery stores and the medical facilities.

It was also a good experiment, noting that some of the center lane flex posts have already been struck and broken. This shows that drivers are not in control of their vehicles and could strike a pedestrian or person on a bike or wheelchair just as easily.

I would encourage you to place something more solid and permanent on the residential streets. For example, River and Waubeek are long straight streets that promote fast and dangerous speeds. I encourage you to place permanent chicaines on streets like these to narrow the streets and force drivers to slow down. (consider this a request to the office of Public Works to complete an investigation).

There were three preventable vehicle collisions on Bowes Street last week that I am aware of. These are near miss events that will eventually lead to the fatality or serious injury of someone not inside a vehicle trying to use that space. I don't want to see this in the ER when I am working please.

On a brighter note, I am pleased to see some community discussion about the Old Town Beach Bridge. The community seems committed to protecting car-free space for active transportation and fitness.

I will attach some more resources for your review. I support the GBB regional climate action plan, specifically objectives 6 and 7, but I disagree with the statement on page 29 about active transportation initiatives not being feasible in rural communities. To that effect, I will link the Complete Streets for Canada's background information on complete streets for rural communities.

If there is any way you think I can be of assistance, I would be happy to help. I am working to slowly build community connections to work toward active transportation advocacy.

# A Living Colour of Light: Yvonne Williams and the Art of Stained Glass

On Sunday, November 2, 1997, the friends, family, and members of the congregation of St. Michael and All Angels in Toronto gathered for a memorial service to honor Yvonne Williams (1901–1997).

Prior to her death at the age of 96, Williams was unquestionably among the most prolific and important artists in North America, producing hundreds of stained-glass artworks while training multiple generations of aspiring glass artists. Trained at the Ontario College of Art (now Ontario College of Art and Design) in Toronto from 1922 to 1926, Williams continued her post bachelor's education in glass production through apprenticeships in St. Louis, Philadelphia, and Boston while also learning from direct observation and study of historical and in-situ glass in England, France, and Italy. Of these diverse experiences, it was her studies at Chartres, France and apprenticeship at Charles Connick Studios in Boston that truly shaped Williams' techniques and love of glass. After her time in Boston, Williams returned to Canada and began a partnership with artist Esther Johnson (d. June 1970) in 1934.

It was not until 1949 that Williams established her permanent stained-glass studio at 3 Caribou Road in Toronto. The location served as her foundry and home for the next thirty years, where she produced over four hundred commissions in Canada and the United States. Upon closing her studio in 1971, Williams retired to Parry Sound (Ontario) where she continued to work through the 1990s until she passed away on September 26, 1997.

Of the many locations for which she produced windows, Saint Michael and All Saints was particularly nostalgic for the artist, which might be unexpected in light of the church's former Canon's remarks, "Her spirituality was not church based... She had an unbelievable faith in God...but she wasn't going to be tied up in a lot of churchy stuff". As Reverend John Erb notes, the parish, just some six kilometers away from her studio, was among the first locations for which Williams produced glass during the early years of her career, earning her first commission there in 1944. Over the next two decades, Williams and her associates would fill all but four of the church's twenty-eight windows. Moreover, the windows show a dynamic progression in Williams' style and confidence in handling of glass and her identity as an artist.

As seen in churches, hospitals, schools, and private buildings, Williams' innovative style heavily influenced the modernization of stained glass in North America. Rather than continuing the legacy of Victorian realism with its rigid design and primary colors, she chose to look back to the most formative period of the medium: the Middle Ages. Looking at her modern abstract designs and rich jewel tones, it may at first seem contradictory that medieval works like those in York

(twelfth century), Cambridge (fourteenth century) and Chartres Cathedral (twelfth century) had such a profound impact on Williams' work. Nonetheless, the bejeweled nature of the medieval windows inspired Williams to juxtapose and explore an unyielding range of color combinations in her work. The impact of studying the design and techniques of European windows can also be seen in her practice of using colored glass blown in the original method from England, Germany, and France. In fact, Gustav Weisman, who worked out of the Yvonne Williams Studio for several years, stated: "It is difficult to find another glass studio in Canada with such respect for the aims of medieval artists, as distinct from mannered work." Further, as Helena Kuprosky elegantly put: "Inspired by medieval glass painters, her highly developed style is entirely original, bespeaking the symbols and spirit of the modern world. Religious and powerful, these statements call to the visual experience."

A two-year apprenticeship with Charles Connick (1875-1945), a well-known painter, muralist, stained glass designer, and proponent of the ideals of the Gothic Revival, allowed Williams to learn the methods of professional window making while solidifying the medieval influence in her early style. The emulation of Connick's style in her early works can be seen in the figurative and representational subjects in The Annunciation (1949), The Resurrection (1949), and her first window in St. Michael's and All Angels, Christ in Glory (1945). In Christ in Glory, Williams' design was complemented by her meticulous color palette she employed. The window depicts the Ascension of Christ (Acts 1:10-11) with saints, including St. Joan, St. Francis, and St. John the Evangelist standing with the Virgin Mary and images of families and working people of the 1940s. Adjacent windows show the disciples and angels as onlookers. With subtlety, she veers away from the conventions of ecclesiastical art. as Christ is beardless. Globe and Mail critic Pearl McCarthy described the newly created window on July 7, 1945: "The countenance, turned slightly to the side, is both firm and poetic. There is a suggestion of calm, far vision... Action, rather than immobility, is suggested. We are away from the stereotyped concept, yet not away from the tradition." Furthermore, it is the only window with a fillet line, a type of narrow decorative border, which is a double line of about two inches in width. Finding more freedom without the framing lines, she abandoned this traditional border in her later work, as seen in the transept windows The Resurrection (south wall), The Annunciation (north wall), and The Crucifixion (1947). According to


Williams, who wrote in 1982 while reflecting on her times at St. Michael and All Angels, "This influence [Connick's] shows in the conventions of tracing lines in hair, hands and drapery. In theory these solid black lines were to have the effect of holding the surface of the window, visually, in a horizontal plane even when light and color seem to move back and forward through the stabilizing grid of black." Akin to her Baptism windows in St. Olave's Anglican Church in Toronto, the style of brushwork when applying pigment in Christ in Glory is a trait of Connick's studio. However, within a very short period, Williams began to approach glass differently.


Writing to long-time friend and critic, Helen Frye. Williams states that "it [glass] depends as no other upon climatic conditions; it responds to each variation of the sun's rays; its form is living colors vitalized by light." Her passion for exploring the living color of light and conscientious effort to enhance the viewers experience is what drove Williams' production for the next sixty years. Take for example, The Resurrection window at St. Michael and All Angels. In her contributions to the church's pamphlet, The Stained Glass Windows of St. Michael and All Angels Church. Williams provides readers detailed instructions about where to stand in order to see The Resurrection at its best effect. Similarly, she notes that the color distribution of intense ruby, blue, and orange appear obvious if one is able to magnify the window (through optical aids like binoculars), yet, when viewed from Williams' suggested observer position located at the center of the nave, the area seems much smaller and less obvious, as intended by the artist. She explains: "This was achieved by correctly judging the required addition of tinted white glass and neutralized or 'greyed' colours." Furthermore, she enhanced the effects of glass by painting it to guide the light and allowing color to go olitside the lead strips. Indeed, Williams crafts similar visual traits into the large West window that depicts the Crucifixion. In the window, the figure of Christ is outlined in a very narrow strip of several hundred small pieces of varied-color glass. The effects of the minuscule pieces are not readily visible to


Left: Williams' Suggested Viewing Angle of The Resurrection. Photo: Iraboty Kazi


Top right: Yvonne Williams, The Crucifixion, 1947. West Was St. Michael and All Angels, Toronto. Photo: Iraboty Kazi



the naked eye except on particularly bright days or specific times of the day, such as just before sunset. In other words, Williams is consciously manipulating the dynamic effects of climatic and temporal conditions upon her windows. As her career progressed, Williams took this effort further. She did so by relying on "the right colours, lines, rhythm, and lively sparkle... to carry the [religious] message." Here conscious design element choices, in that of color, line, etc., fosters the window's narrative meaning as it allows viewers to respond instinctively or as, Williams wrote, "Through the heart' rather than rational thought" when viewing her ecclesiastical works.

Her desire to evoke meditation and emotion over rational thought inevitably pushed Williams to greater abstraction in her stained-glass production. Although she keeps figural forms in her abstract designs, such as the large angel surrounded by a sea of blue in Sermon on the Mount (1969), works are more evocative of the non-representational art so prevalent during the mid-twentieth century. As Williams writes, "in this last period [at St. Michael and All Angels]...It seems, however, that I could not go wholly abstract but have kept human features recognizable."

Despite not fully embracing abstraction, Williams relies upon the tenets of abstract art's reliance on color to convey mood. This is explicit in the Garden of Gethsemane (1959). To convey the tension of the historical moment, when Jesus is arrested leading to his eventual crucifixion, Williams does not offer a literal rendition of Jesus' time in the garden as recorded in the New Testament; rather, she uses strong color juxtapositions to convey eschatological tenets and mood instead of representational forms. Williams draws upon scripture from the Gospel of Luke: "And there appeared an angel unto him from heaven, strengthening him" (Luke 22:43). Visually, the arms of an angel in white with gold wings comforts the kneeling Jesus. A small choir of angels in red rejoice for mankind's salvation that will result from his sacrifice. Counter to the joyful banner of the angel are Roman soldiers led by Judas Iscariot who are coming to Christ. Their malevolence is emphasized through Williams' deliberateness in illustrating the omnipresence of death that will soon come to Christ's physical body. She does so by carefully changing



which change from green to an orange as soldiers' approach. In the work, Williams relies upon complex compositional design's color "to carry the message."

Williams would continue this practice through the 1970s, as we can see with the Priscilla window at St. John the Evangelist, London, Ontario. Although recognizable from her face, hands, and feet, the early Christian convert is a bejeweled color field of abstract forms and glass patterns. Similarly, at McMaster Divinity College, Hamilton, Ontario her Memorial Windows series incorporates dozens of shades of greens, blues, and mauves. As Robert Fulford states, "she stands as the Canadian leader of a school that is pushing stained glass past its traditional boundaries and into the rewarding fields of symbolism and impression. This movement is almost as old as modern art, and in some ways parallels it."

Why Williams moved to abstraction is further clarified through her own writings about stained glass art and painting traditions. She is adamant that "Stained-glass is not a realistic painting made translucent... It is a luminous color of great beauty which makes use of light as part of itself." The very notion of color and light as integral to one another explains the increased structural and design complexity of her windows. Indeed, the intricacy of her design practice explicitly lent itself to abstraction as numerous windows consisted of thousands of pieces of glass including, The Transfiguration at the Church of the Transfiguration incorporates over 1,700 pieces of glass, while the aforementioned window of The Resurrection has over 3,400 pieces of glass. The inclusion of thousands of panes of glass reflects her continuous experimentations in colors that are found throughout her hundreds of commissions.

Such diversity of glass motifs and compositions lent itself to other forms of complexity manifesting in her oeuvre. At St. Michael and All Angels, Williams seemingly portrays Christ's face differently in each of the church's windows. As the church's local historian, Doris M. Banks notes, in 1963, "no two people ever think of Him [Christ] in exactly the same way." Such multiplicity of perceptions was recognized by Williams, allowing her to vary the painted figures of her windows to facilitate individualized experiences and perceptions, as well as engage with the larger history of art and ecclesiastical practices. In The Crucifixion window, following the customs of medieval artists, Williams chooses to portray the

larger than life, seven-foot Jesus in total acceptance of God's will and his sacrifice rather than focusing on his pain. She associates the suffering of Christ with the human suffering caused by war, referencing 1 and 2 Corinthians (12:26 and 4:6), or as Williams states, "When our hearts are in pain He suffers with us; When we hurt others we hurt Him." The act of universal suffering of Christ for man is well known and recognized through Christ's Crucifixion, and Williams deliberately shows man struggles in the window. In the fifth lancet, Lucifer is seen pressing upon despondent humans, whose struggles are made clearer through their juxtaposition to the first lancet depicting St. Michael, who carries the flaming sword of Justice, surrounded by a joyful throng of people. These figures, whose emotions are illuminated through contrasting lights and dark tonalities, symbolize the struggle between good and evil in earthly life and are further a reminder that Christ, through his sacrifice, conquers all.




Ellen Simon, The People's Window, 1983, South Porch (south wall), St. Michael and All Angels, Toronto. Photo: C. Cody Barteet

Williams also engages with more obscure ecclesiastical messages to inspire meditation by not only the lay congregation, but also its spiritual leaders. Such concepts are found in The Resurrection. Both Christ (central lancet) and the flanking angels (left and right lancets) appear from the rays of light emanating from the barely visible, broken tomb. The luminous figures are surrounded by a vesica, or an oval made from the intersection of two disks of the same radius. The subtle inclusion of the vesica ties directly to Williams' efforts to engage numerous audiences through her windows. In this instance, some members of the congregation would recognize it as "one of the secret symbols used among early Christians at the time of the Roman persecution" while others would recognize the complex geometry and patterning of her windows.

Williams' efforts to challenge viewers and patrons, through abstraction or non-traditional modes of hagiography, at times, caused some controversy. Despite some initial claims of the congregation at St. Michael and All Angels being pleased with her newly installed window, the window was not without controversy, largely due to the young Williams

portraying Christ without a beard. "It was phenomenal, the controversy that it caused," said Rev. John Erb, who was the Toronto church's rector for sixteen years. But, here Williams again attempted to provide routes through which observers could engage as well as meditate on Christ's death and its meaning to doxology and Christian practices. In other words, to recall Rev. Erb's statements, "she wasn't going to be tied up in a lot of churchy stuff."


While the windows in St. Michael and All Angels are a visual testament of the artists' immense talent, outside of the stained-glass community, it is less known that there is a large scale of teamwork required to create these pieces. Writing to Doris M. Banks, Williams notes, "I feel that there is no reason why I should be given recognition by name and other people not. Though a large portion of the work is mine only the passing of centuries can reveal which window will contain most that is worthy artistically and in meaning." The other people that Williams is referring to is her long-term collaborator, Ellen Simon, as well as the firms of Brownsgrove Guild (England) and Robert McCausland (Toronto). Broomsgrove and

McCausland are well-known makers of glass; so too is Simon who began her career with Williams and continued to work with her for nearly forty years, dividing her time between Williams' studio and New York where she settled in the 1950s. Like Williams, Simon had a profound affection for St. Michael and All Angels. Upon reflecting on her career during an interview, Simon specifically draws attention to two windows at the church: The People's Window (1983) and The Angels Window (1983), at the highest esteem.

Further, there were many others who worked with Williams at the parish, and she intentionally went out of her way to ensure their names were recognized, including Michael Nuttgens, Ethel M. Scott, and John Greene, all of whom contributed to the production of her windows at the parish and elsewhere. Nuttgens, who painted the glass for Christ Healing the Cripple (1961), The Sermon on the Mount, The Nativity (1971), and The Temptation (1969) windows, had strong ties to Williams' studio, having worked there for several years after immigrating to Canada in 1956. For other projects, she invited artists, such as Rosemary Kilbourn, Gustav Weisman, Jerome McNicholl, Stephen

Bélanger-Taylor, and Sarah Hall to collaborate with her, thus providing indispensable training and experience to younger generations. Williams believed that "so much depends on this gaining of experience, and on the understanding and criticism of fellow artists." Even at the age of 77, she mentored her last apprentice, Helena Kuprowsky, for three years. "She always believed in passing on her knowledge and allowing her associates to develop their own style," said Williams' nephew, John Gillespie.

The Yvonne Williams Studio was recognized in the Canadian stained glass community for its innovative egalitarian structure in a fashion akin to the European Art and Crafts glass houses, a departure from the strict hierarchy and sharply defined tasks of a traditional glass studio. Influenced by her time at the Connick Studio, Williams encouraged the collaboration of her assistants and students, as well as of other artists, in various phases of designing and producing windows, which included everything from the initial watercolor sketch, through the full-size cartoon and the choosing of the colored glass, to the painting and firing of the glass. Yvonne Williams

Studio commissions were done at times by a single artist but more often were done collaboratively. Artists working at the studio could also execute their own commissions, with complete autonomy. For example, Gustav Weisman executed his window for Ontario Ladies College Chapel at Whitby in the studio. The designs, cartoons and glass painting were done by the artists, while the technical aspects of cutting, glazing and installations were done by craftsman George London, whom Williams met when making her first window for Pringle & London Glaziers in Toronto in 1926. London had a successful lifelong partnership with Williams after he joined her studio and handled the technical aspects of cutting, glazing, and installation for thirty years. In dividing up the work at the studio, Yvonne relied on her own metrics, which was based on percentages for each part of the job of making a window. She stated: "My contribution here was to solve added management problems; my gain was in stimulating exchanges and friendships."

Williams and her studio were also recognized for the high standards of production. Robert G. Calvert, who designed her studio at 3 Caribou Road, said: "She's known among architects as the best in her field. They love to work with her." The strong appreciation of her work was recognized by others. As Rev. Erb notes, "Miss Williams was a passionate guardian of her work, checking in on her windows and lobbying against trees being planted too near the church. She was always upset about anything that might block the light, and that was quite understandable." Such commitment to glass practice, production, and knowledge led to Williams' undeniable success. Over

her career, she received many accolades and honors: the Governor General's Gold Medal for Excellence in Life Drawing and Design (1927), the Royal Architectural Institute of Canada Allied Arts Medal (1955), election to the Royal Canadian Academy of Arts (1965), and the selection of two of her stained glass windows as the subjects of the twenty-cent stamp in 1976 and the fifty-two cent Christmas stamp in 1997. Such honors were appropriate, considering her life-long devotion to her craft, profound impact on future generations, and role in shaping the trajectory of modern Canadian stained glass with her stylistic innovations and tremendous output.

Cody Barteet is an Associate Professor of Art History at the University of Western Ontario. He has published widely on Hispanic and Maya cultural interactions in colonial Yucatan. Likewise, he recently began publishing materials on the stained glass art of Ontario and Canada. His recent pieces include an essay on Christopher Wallis for The Journal of Stained Glass (The British Society of Master Glass Painters, 2022) and on the stained glass of St. John the Evangelist church in London, Ontario (2024).

Iraboty Kazi (she/her) is a Bangladeshi Canadian PhD candidate at the University of Western Ontario. She is studying Art and Visual Culture, and her doctoral research explores the connections between Early Modern pastoral paintings and constructions of nature in contemporary queer cinema. In addition, she is collaborating with Dr. Cody Barteet on a project on stained glass in Canada, particularly focusing on Yvonne Williams.

Last year a family of fishers nested under the bridge.

I offer the following comments:

- 1. 2009 in disrepair and discussion by town to repair.
- 2. 2019 required repair and STAFF recommended removal.
- 3. 2021 approval to repair at \$40,000 that may have actually cost \$49,000.
- 4. The bridge has important significance as a historical pathway and community marker. It provides a look out. A place for reflection and is a welcoming space in general. Often people stop and consider it a place of rest.
- 5. The bridge provides for a level pass for pedestrians, cyclists, and snow machines.
- 6. The bridge provides a natural barrier to the beach area.
- 7. The beach area has suffered flooding and washouts, a new path will suffer the same if infrastructure is not put in place to support that.
- 8. The beach area has parking as does the sailing club. This will be reduced should the bridge be removed.
- 9. Fire suppression does not require the trucks to be on the beach side of the bridge, nor does rescue. Consider this area to be an unserviced area of town unless walked in.
- 10. The building of infrastructure to the north can be done without the demolition of the bridge and it is short sighted to place such importance, so that the bridge be removed.
- 11. Development of the town should not compromise beloved access points and areas of
- 12. The town has a history of promises in relation to the waterfront trail that has been challenged and disappointing:
  - a. The Waubano beach bridge was washed out and never repaired. The Town neglected to remedy it, and left the metal frame and concrete rather than remedy. This was unfortunate and negligent on the part of the operations group.
  - b. The Fitness trail had multiple installations that were well used and enjoyed by many. The Town removed them without notice or consultation in spring two years ago and promised they would be replaced with new two years ago. No installations were replaced. On questioning this in the past few weeks, we are told they are coming.
  - c. The canteen is always considered for closing on a year to year basis. What a shame.
  - d. The lifeguard situation is always a problem at our ONE guarded beach.
  - e. The waterpark was in then it was out, then in, then finally out. In the end I agreed it was not necessary for Waubano Beach.
  - f. The town has multiple styles of garbage cans on the trail system. This shows a lack of vision and continuity. Could we not have matching garbage cans from one end to the other?
  - g. There are too few picnic tables and some years there are more than others.
- 13. What is the most used space in our beautiful community? The trail system. People love

- it. They talk about it and they admire how we have kept it fairly natural.
- 14. Staff work so hard to create a beautiful space for us to swim, enjoy the park and beaches. Thank you to staff for your efforts at keeping the parks clean and cut and safe.

Many others will speak to the needs, access, engineering and logistics of having the bridge removed and the importance of keeping it.

As a community member who lives near Waubano Road, I implore the Town of Parry Sound to consider the importance of this bridge and consider the need to keep it. Is \$350k a realistic repair bill? I think not, but if it is, it is the cost of running a municipality. In the 8 years I have been walking this bridge, I have yet to meet up with a town councillor or city staff walking here. I did once see two OPP on foot patrol. Perhaps town leaders should try walking it, they may see what we all see. When walking, have a look at and replace the Waubano beach point bridge and return the trail installations.

Do not remove the bridge. Fix it, if it really needs fixing.

Dear Mayor McGarvey and Councillors,

I am writing to express my strong support for the preservation of the Bridge near the Old Town Beach on the Waterfront Trail in Parry Sound, with particular emphasis on maintaining the historic walking bridge that offers stunning views of Georgian Bay while keeping the walk flat, safe and accessible to all.

Removing the bridge that separates walking traffic from vehicle traffic on Waubuno Road is not advisable due to several key safety concerns. Waubuno Road is characterized by its steep (18 meters), winding nature and is well treed, which significantly reduces visibility for both drivers and pedestrians. The road's oblique angle at the intersection further complicates visibility, making it difficult for drivers to see pedestrians and vice versa. This hazardous environment increases the likelihood of accidents, especially at intersections where quick decisions and clear lines of sight are crucial.

This change is not in the Master Plan for Trails. One of the Master Plan's key objectives is to avoid user conflicts and ensure safety, which this proposal contradicts. Mixing pedestrian and vehicle traffic on such a challenging road raises collision risks, particularly during peak hours or in low-light conditions. Winter ice and summer speeding further endanger shared spaces. The absence of community consultation undermines the proposal's credibility, and removing the bridge without thorough assessment threatens public safety, as it is a beloved community asset providing safe pedestrian passage.

Furthermore, I am deeply concerned that many residents, who spend their entire summer at the cottage or are fully engaged in their employment, will not even be aware of this significant change. These individuals, integral parts of our community, will not have the opportunity to voice their concerns or contribute to the discussion. It is crucial that we involve all members of our community in such important decisions to ensure that the trail, which holds such immense value to us all, is preserved and enhanced in a manner that aligns with our collective vision and needs.

I urge you to consider these multifaceted benefits and the profound impact on our community as you deliberate on the future of the Waterfront Trail and the historic walking bridge. Thank you for your attention to this matter.

#### To Mayor and Council

This bridge has held a special place in my heart since I was a child, when steam locomotives trundled along the spur line. Even then, we used that railbed to get to the beach. Today, with limited mobility, its level path is the safest walk in town.

I also share the Town's interest in developing the north end properties. Added assessment is essential for the community to grow.

However, I cannot agree that removing the Waubuno Road Bridge is the answer to servicing that development. Too much of Parry Sound's heritage value has been lost, beyond the control of the municipality. This is within your control.

Heritage buildings in some places have strict controls on repairs and replacements. If, for example, your building has a 400-year old beam as its mantel, you must replace it with another 400-year-old beam.

Our local heritage rules provide for a replacement with like appearance. If it looks exactly the same, the heritage is considered respected and preserved.

In many parts of the world, faltering beloved structures are shored up with modern supports, leaving the original façade; therefore, identical appearance but the supporting structure unseen, sound and safe.

My first thought was to rebuild and reinforce the bridge with concrete and steel, but reface by returning the beams, pillars and planks that make its appearance so special.

Surely there is a long enough span of new materials, for light traffic, that a new support could be hidden from view.

Looking at the Waubuno Bridge, its enormous sloping pillars and beams are striking and distinctive. The angle of the road places them in full view as one slows on the approach from either side.

Behind them in profile, the abutments appear to be shored up by rocks.

Could not the deck be supported by concrete and steel abutments painted or disguised to recede from view, wings grass-covered, and with a facade of the huge timbers just as they are now, but supporting nothing, yet presenting the same much-loved heritage appearance to passersby.

As for the deck span, possibly place the new indestructible materials, but present a wooden appearance using existing materials to disguise the replacement.

Speaking only for myself, what I do want to see at first glance is the evidence of the century old construction exactly as it greets the eye today, the massive wooden pillars, beams and timbers of railway heritage.

Jamie McGarvey - I read you postponed the vote for the Old Town Beach Bridge until September 3, 2024 in order to get public input. I attended the Town Council meeting on August 13th. I feel that this is just a formality and you are paying lip service to us, as you also asked for public input for the Lighthouse condominiums before they went up and the vote also to change the zoning behind the daycare on Waubeek Street to high density. In both these cases the public, a great number of residents of Parry Sound, opposed both situations and although you, the Mayor and Council may have heard what we said you did not implement anything that was written, voiced and put forward at the council meetings.

In the case of the Lighthouse Condominiums, it was spoken at the meeting that we needed affordable housing. For most people in our town they are not affordable and did not help the housing situation. The Heartbreak for the people in Beacon View still reverberates today in the community. Their views of the Bay should have been protected by our Council. Now, you are asking again for input on the old town beach bridge. As this town council is not open and transparent in their intentions of future development, I am also addressing in this letter the infrastructure that may be proposed to be put in under our Trail for future development and the protection of the use of the Old Town Beach for the public.

Speaking on behalf of all aging veterans in our town, the Algonquin Regiment Veterans' Association strongly objects to the Town's Public Works recommendation to remove the footbridge over Waubuno Rd. on that trail which was named in 1991 to honour Algonquin Regiment veterans. We agree with and support Parry Sound Council's original decision to use the available funds to proceed with repairs to preserver the bridge, this expenditure in accordance with the Town's 2024 Capital Budget, as passed in April 2024.

The Waubuno footbridge provides the safest form of transit over a roadway for people of all ages and abilities. We especially speak for senior citizens whose frailties and declining physical strength consider being on the Trail as one of the last outdoor activities they can still manage safely. What seems a gentle slope to Public Works is a daunting obstacle to we who use canes or motorized scooters. There is always added concern when the weather changes and the elderly have to guard against slipping on wet leaves or thin slicks of ice. With care and concentration, we can manage those things, but add the danger of slope, and many of us forego our walk or do only a half-walk. We also appreciate the bridge as a natural stopping place mid-walk or mid-ride. It's a place that provides us with an opportunity to enjoy a view of the Bay, and more often a chance to have a conversation with younger people on the trail. The bridge is a nice place to rest and socialize. With the inclusion of the footbridge, we know will be able to enjoy a safe walking path, with the added bonus of parking at both ends, Stockey Centre and New Town Beach.

For those of us who have lived in this town for seven, eight, maybe even nine decades, we ask that the Waubuno footbridge continue to be repaired, not just for us, but for our children and grandchildren. That little bridge is an important part of Parry Sound history.

#### Dear Ms. Johnson,

I am not a "local" and by that, I mean I was not born in Parry Sound. That seems to be the determining factor among "locals" as to who is a local and who is not. However, I am a very long term, year round resident who chose to move her family here almost 21 years ago. My husband and I were looking for a quieter, more simple life for our young family and when a job came up in Parry Sound, we jumped at the chance to make this town our home.

We love living in Parry Sound and though we miss the conveniences of southern Ontario, we wouldn't go back! One of our favourite things about Parry Sound is the fitness trail. We walk it almost daily and are always thankful that we get to live in this beautiful place.

As you know, there is much community speculation (gossip!) about the plans for the bridge over Waubano Road that allows the fitness trail to cross the road. I am not one to respond to gossip, however, I do want to take the time to express some thoughts and concerns about the future of this bridge.

Firstly, the Waubano bridge is a part of our town's history and heritage. I teach school in town and I can assure you that most children do not know anything about the town's history of logging. This bridge is a "living, breathing" example of that history and it would be a shame to lose it.

Secondly, if the bridge is becoming unsafe, there is absolutely a need to correct that situation. There are many options, I am sure, that would allow the reinforcement and repairs necessary while still maintaining the historical nature of the bridge itself.

Thirdly, there is talk of removing the bridge and grading the trail so it crosses on the roadway. While I can see some benefit to doing this (eg widening the road so that two vehicles can pass), I have serious concerns about this. As a regular user of the fitness trail, I can assure you that crossing the roadway at the "new beach" is like taking your life into your hands! Drivers do not stop for pedestrians and often are driving far too quickly for the area they are in. I fear that will be the case should the bridge be removed at Waubano Road. With our town being a tourist destination, we have many, many visitors driving on our streets who are not familiar with the area. We also have visitors walking the trail who are not familiar with the area. Avoiding a potentially dangerous situation is in the best interest of everyone.

Fourthly, our town is brimming with seniors who enjoy using the fitness trail. It is one of the only forms of exercise available to the general public. Adding an incline and a decline will make the trail far less accessible for anyone with mobility issues. Even those who use motorized scooters and such may have difficulty navigating the trail without the bridge. A good heavy rainfall could also cause erosion on a slope, resulting in increased work required by the town to maintain the trail. A good example of this is the end of the trail that was modified at the Salt Dock entrance when the condominium building was built. It is perpetually washed out and often difficult to navigate.

And lastly, the bridge that was taken out by a storm many, many years ago that goes out to the "point" at the new beach has yet to be replaced. Perhaps focusing our efforts on making that area accessible would be a good use of time and money.



#### Re: Not in Favour of Proposed Removal of Waubuno Footbridge

We are not in favour of the recommendation to remove the Waubuno Footbridge, and to replace it with a sloping (5%) path.

We are an elderly couple, residents of Parry Sound since 2008, though our connection to the Town goes back generations. Stephen walks twice a day, morning and afternoon on the Trail. Susan walks less often, but still several times a week. Stephen has mobility and balance issues and walks slowly with a cane or walking sticks. Susan has peripheral neuropathy in her feet which makes walking painful, but can manage walking on a level surface. We used to walk the many rugged trails in and around Town, but with age and diminished physical abilities, that is no longer possible. The Fitness Trail is the last trail we can manage, and we love that it is level and has a comfortable walking service.

The Recommendation Background states that its considerations are financial and operational, but gives no consideration to the value of the footbridge to taxpayers, and by value, we are referring to accessibility for those with mobility changes, parents with strollers, and the pleasure we all enjoy in walking along a flat, well-surfaced pathway. Many appreciate not just the historic but also the nostalgic value of the trail and footbridge. The footbridge also has a value as a stopping place where conversations take place, an opportunity for the human interactions that are so important to our health and wellbeing.

It is our position that most taxpayers would be more than willing to pay for town amenities that are useful and give them pleasure. Put a different way, taxpayers would be very upset with the Town if the footbridge were removed and replaced with a sloping pathway, which will be more difficult for mobility challenged and older walkers, as well as parents pushing strollers.

We'd like to look a bit more closely at the advantages and/or disadvantages presented, which do not mention human utility of pleasure, but focus on financial and operational points.

Removal (\$150K - \$200K) provides a cost savings over rehabilitation AND requirement for bi-annual engineering inspections is removed. We don't know if you've provided enough information to the public to prove that this is a good reason. Does this cost include the removal AND also the realignment of the trail to produce the

5% grade drop level crossing? Does the report's "cost' include the higher probability of slip and fall in winter (insurance/litigation). Somewhere there is a reference to snowmobile use over the <u>foot</u>bridge, so we ask, is the need to support the weight of snowmobiles on the footbridge inflating the cost to maintain and replace the bridge? If so, we ask why a greatly diminished use of snowmobiles (given recent weather), should impact the replacement/repair costs of a bridge that is used daily by walkers.

Minimal overall disruption in the use of the Fitness Trail – We disagree. We know what a 5% gradient means. How extra many feet will people have to walk on this 5% gradient to bypass the Waubuno crossing? The 5% gradient will be challenging, possibly even dangerous for some walkers. Has the Town considered the higher risk of slip and fall on a slope in winter? Further, some people will avoid that section of the trail, both winter and summer, in order to avoid the slope and extra steps. Since the footbridge is in the middle of the trail, people who used to walk the whole trail, might choose to walk half the trail and turn back. The sloping path would surely be a significant disruption in the use of the Fitness Trail.

Removes the barrier to emergency and service vehicles — We disagree. Currently ambulances can reach Old Town Beach, so this isn't about ambulances. Is it about firetrucks? If so, what is the probability of the sailing school or a plastic portapotty catching fire? Is the probability of fire and the necessity for large emergency vehicles so great that removing the footbridge is justified? We don't think so. Further, if such large vehicles need access the Old Town Beach, there is alternate access from the Coast Guard Station driveway, turn left on the Trail and bear right to the beach. The minimal need for large emergency or service vehicles on the Beach is not sufficient reason to remove the footbridge.

Removal ensures a viable infrastructure corridor exists to permit development of vacant lands in the North section of Town — We have to admit I was a bit perplexed by this reason. What development? What service infrastructure? The water treatment plant is far to the north of the footbridge, so it can't be water and sewage. Is it natural gas? Is it electricity? Why is it that one of the things we love the most about living in Parry Sound has to be sacrificed for development. Please find a different way to route the infrastructure.

Rehabilitate the bridge and investigate further possible deficiencies — This option is presented as something to be avoided, costly, both now and in the future. Yet who hasn't admired an older home or even bought one, knowing there will be a higher cost to maintain such a home. Our family owned a big old house on Belvedere for a long time. The pleasure of owning something old makes the cost worthwhile. We love the Waubuno footbridge. It connects us to our past, both historical and personal, and for us, we don't begrudge the cost for replacing and/or maintaining it.

We respectfully ask that Town of Parry Sound repair the Waubuno footbridge now and not remove it, and commit to a regular and thorough maintenance program in future years. We ask this not just for our sake, but for the sake of our children and grandchildren. We want to leave some of the history of Parry Sound to them.



I am writing to share my views on an important matter for Parry Sound residents and visitors. Specifically, I am concerned about the potential removal of the wood deck bridge on the Rotary Algonquin Regiment Fitness Trail.

While my wife and I live in North Bay, we have travelled to Parry Sound many times for business and pleasure. A highlight for us is the waterfront fitness trail. We are fortunate to have accessible trails in North Bay and area but the Parry Sound trail is exceptional. The foresight to plan and implement this trail in order capture the views and nature in this area was commendable. The wooden deck bridge is a significant feature. As a person who has severe arthritis (knee requiring brace and a cane to ambulate), I enjoy this trail. I appreciate the bridge as it maintains a level pathway without having to add another level crossing of a roadway. I understand that the removal of the bridge with ramps either side of a level road crossing is under consideration.

My research reveals that this level crossing and with the approach ramps would be "to code." This, of course is an imperative. However, I know from personal experience that walking across a level bridge is easier than a path that declines then rises plus negotiating any traffic at the level crossing.

As well, I understand that this bridge is a remnant of the original railway right of way. It would be unfortunate to lose this historical connection.

In the June 18th council meeting a motion was made to postpone the decision regarding the recommendation of the removal of the structure over Waubuno Rd on the fitness trail, until the September 3 meeting. There was direction "that council provide the opportunity for public consultation on the proposed project before further deliberation or decision making takes place."

It is now July 17, and I as well as others I have spoken with have not seen any information regarding public consultation.



The old bridge is problematic in several ways. For one, it's ugly as sin. For another, the gaps between the decking boards are unsafe - bicycles are easily destabilized. For yet another, it's low height and length mean that access to old town beach on waubuno rd is problematic: a single small car can sneak through fine, but more vehicles or larger emergency vehicles would have trouble. Finally, if the engineering reports are to be believed, the bridge is unsound anyway.

Clearly the old bridge should be removed, but what to do in it's place?

Having no bridge and simply re-grading the trail is a horrible idea. The slope and elevation change will make the trail less accessible for seniors or the disabled.

Replacing it with a similar bridge would solve the engineering problem, but not the additional issues i mentioned.

Instead, this is an opportunity to build a great new bridge. Something that would be a show piece, something that would attract people, something people would take pictures of.

Build a longer bridge, and that will allow waubuno to be widened to a proper width. Put a slight arc in the bridge design, and you can increase the height clearance on waubuno to allow things like fire trucks to clear. Put a stair case at one or both ends and you increase pedestrian access to old town beach. Put some thought into the design of the railings - perhaps some light stands - and you can make it beautiful and a tourist attraction. This is an opportunity both to fix problems and create something good. Or you could go the typical parry sound route and muddle it up with something lame and mediocre.

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

Regarding the Waubuno Pedestrian Bridge, the best long-term option is to replace the existing bridge. The reasons to replace the bridge are as follows:

- 1. Providing access to emergency vehicles. Replacing the bridge will allow emergency vehicles to access the area beyond the current bridge by widening the laneway and increasing the overhead clearance.
- 2. The Council Report and Recommendation, dated June 18, 2024, states, "...the buried wood components of the bridge structure may require further work once they are uncovered and available for inspection." Repairing the existing bridge will undoubtedly lead to unforeseen and potentially significant expenses that may exceed the \$350,000 estimate. In contrast, replacing the bridge would prevent such cost overruns, making it a more financially prudent choice and a sound long-term investment.
- 3. A replacement bridge using modern building materials and techniques will provide a better long-term solution. The existing bridge was previously repaired approximately 14 years ago. A repair to the bridge might last another 14 years. In contrast, a new bridge, adequately maintained, would last much longer without needing repairs, thereby saving future repair costs. For example, a steel structure with a reinforced concrete foundation would not have the same issues as the current wooden structure.
- 4. Replacing the bridge would most likely require upgrades to the road passing under the bridge. While I need to familiarize myself with the infrastructure plans for the north end of town, I propose that preparations for future water and sewage infrastructure installations be included in the bridge construction and road upgrades. This approach could potentially minimize future disruptions to the area and reduce future infrastructure costs by avoiding the need for separate construction projects and the associated disruptions.
- 5. Although removing the existing bridge and creating a level crossing is the most economical option, there are better options for the long-term growth and use of the Fitness Trail. The Fitness Trail must remain accessible for all community members, regardless of age or ability. Too steep a grade at either side of the level crossing will create a usage barrier for many community members, as evidenced by the level crossing on Waubeek Street. Community members who use wheelchairs (including electric wheelchairs) for mobility have challenges at the Waubuno Road level crossing due to the slope angle and ruts on the Trail caused by erosion. A slope to bring the existing Trail down to the level of Waubuno Road will result in similar accessibility issues.

The Council Report and Recommendation, dated June 18, 2024, notes a current project budget of \$350,000 and states that replacing the bridge, according to an estimate from 2009, will cost over \$400,000 (most likely more now, given increased construction and building costs since 2009).

- a. Has the Parry Sound Town Council investigated provincial and federal infrastructure and recreation grants to assist with funding a replacement bridge?
- b. Is replacing the bridge included in the waterfront improvement plan? Could funds be utilized from the waterfront improvement plan to cover the added cost of replacing the bridge?
- c. Have other community stakeholders been approached about contributing funds to replace the bridge? For example, OFSC members use the Trail and bridge during the Winter. Can the OFSC contribute a portion of their local trail maintenance budget to support replacing the bridge?

While cost is always a significant consideration, so is all community members' continued use and enjoyment of the Fitness Trail. I appreciate the Parry Sound Town Council for providing a forum for community members to share their comments and feedback regarding the Waubuno Pedestrian Bridge. I urge the Town Council to thoroughly investigate all viable options and consider all community members' immediate and future needs before making a responsible decision about the Waubuno Pedestrian Bridge.

The trail is used for educational tours and nature exploration activities for schools and community groups. Numerous is times I have personally seen classes and day camps using the trail for this purpose. Flora and fauna anyone?
- Environmental Awareness: Users may develop a greater appreciation for nature and become more involved in environmental conservation efforts.

**Economic Benefits:** 

- Tourism Attraction: The scenic views of Georgian Bay attracts tourists, boosting local businesses. I believe that the Georgian Bay is our secret weapon!
- Learning Population: The availability of the Waterfront Trail and the soon-to-be West Parry Sound Recreational Trail significantly enhances our town's appeal, attracting new residents and much needed health professionals.

Removing the bridge that separates walking traffic from vehicle traffic on Waubuno Road is not advisable due to several key safety concerns. Waubuno Road is characterized by its steep (18 meters), winding nature and is well treed, which significantly reduces visibility for both drivers and pedestrians. The road's oblique angle at the intersection further complicates visibility, making it difficult for drivers to see pedestrians and vice versa.

This hazardous environment increases the likelihood of accidents, especially at intersections where quick decisions and clear lines of sight are crucial.

This change is not in the Master Plan for Trails. One of the Master Plan's key objectives is to avoid user conflicts and ensure safety, which this proposal contradicts. Mixing pedestrian and vehicle traffic on such a challenging road raises collision risks, particularly during peak hours or in low-light conditions. Winter ice and summer speeding further endanger shared spaces. The absence of community consultation undermines the proposal's credibility, and removing the bridge without thorough assessment threatens public safety, as it is a beloved community asset providing safe pedestrian passage.

Furthermore, I am deeply concerned that many residents, who spend their entire summer at the cottage or are fully engaged in their employment, will not even be aware of this significant change. These individuals, integral parts of our community, will not have the opportunity to voice their concerns or contribute to the discussion. It is crucial that we involve all members of our community in such important decisions to ensure that the trail, which holds such immense value to us all, is preserved and enhanced in a manner that aligns with our collective vision and needs.

I urge you to consider these multifaceted benefits and the profound impact on our community as you deliberate on the future of the Waterfront Trail and the historic walking bridge. Thank you for your attention to this matter.

Stringers Extent: Significant rot and bulging in multiple stringers.Cost: \$50,000 Replace Timber

Columns Extent: Full height rot in several columns.Cost: \$11,000 Replace Ballast Wall Extent: Severe rot in the south ballast wall.Cost: \$12,000

**Associated Costs** 

Additional associated costs include engineering, contingency, and mobilization/demobilization: Engineering and Contingency: \$15,000

This is much less than any other prices and making the bridge available for pedestrians would be a major step forward.

The recreational trail is integral to Parry Sound, access to Georgian Bay, and fitness in our town. I worry the plan to remove the bridge without a specific plan for replacement would have detrimental effects. Not all Parry Sounders have access to Georgian Bay, many of us do not have boats or cottages and the fitness trail, including the bridge, allow us to access the Bay. I use the trail almost daily and see people with varying mobility on the trail, people with strollers, crutches, walkers, walking poles, power chairs, and everything in between. A slope in that area instead of a bridge would severely impact the most vulnerable fitness trail users which is absolutely unacceptable. Finally, fitness is a wonderful preventative health measure. Eliminating the bridge, would again reduce accessibility of the trail and free source of fitness for many including those most vulnerable from a public health perspective. #### **Background:**

Through the review of Consent Application B23-02 (32 Great North Road), discussion took place regarding the ability of staff to address concerns that arose due to site alteration that took place prior to the application on the subject lands through mitigation or enforcement. The site alteration was undertaken by the property owner to facilitate the construction of townhouses.

It should be noted that this report is referring to site alteration as a result of small scale residential development only. Residential over 10 dwelling units and non-residential development are subject to site plan control. A detailed review of site alteration matters is undertaken during the site plan control process. This review would include pre and post development controls in addition to mitigation measures that would be applicable during the construction phase of development.

The Town's Property Standards By-law (2012-6103) contains general statements regarding "safe conditions" around holes and excavations. These sections of the Property Standards By-law apply to situations that have been created in some manner and not to address natural landscaping features. After extensive review by staff and legal counsel, it was determined that this clause would not apply to the situation at 32 Great North Road as there was an existing natural hazard on site.

The property owner has since addressed the perceived hazard by filling and landscaping the lower potion of their property where the rock blasting took place, and the neighbours' concerns have therefore been satisfied.

Staff have reviewed this situation, as well as other similar instances, from a number of perspectives and taken into consideration input from the Town's solicitor.

It was determined that taking action on this matter would not be consistent with the intent of the existing by-law and would fundamentally change how the Town enforces site alteration matters throughout the municipality, specifically where there is an existing hazard. Given the rocky terrain of Parry Sound, it is difficult to draw a firm line in the sand or provide specific standards in instances where hazards already exist.

Staff are satisfied that given existing law and discussion of options with the Town's

solicitor, that future situations will continue to be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.

Following discussions with the Town's solicitor, staff have come to the conclusion that

these changes would provide little additional benefit in terms of public safety and liability

for the Town. Further, the Town already has the tools in place to deal with man-made

hazards and situations where no hazards currently exist.

"On December 27, 2017, O. Reg. 588/17 was released which regulates asset management planning for municipal infrastructure," and as part of O. Reg. 588/17, municipalities were required to adopt strategic AM policies by July 1, 2019, update them at least every five years from that date, and provide an annual update to Council on the Asset Management Plan progress.1 On June 18th, 2020, the Town adopted their Strategic Asset Management Policy which has been provided as Appendix B of this report. The regulatory requirements include monitoring progress and providing an annual update to Council on Asset Management Plan progress.

In August 2022, the Town of Parry Sound adopted their updated Asset Management Plan for core infrastructure.

The Town's current asset management plan does include assets in addition to those core assets such as roads, water, sewer, and storm. However, the requirements of the regulation include expansion of detail to include determining current levels of service for the remaining non-core assets. The 2025 activity will include determining proposed levels of service within the asset management plan through stakeholder engagement and a 10-year financial forecast showing the impact of those proposed levels of service.

#### **Asset Management Planning Activity Update:**

Back in 2020, the Town participated in a program called AMP it Up 2.0 offered through MFOA and Ministry of Infrastructure, which involved an assessment of the Town's current asset management planning activities to ultimately develop an action plan that identified steps to be taken to progress the program towards the enhanced requirements.

Through the first Asset Management Plan Update, many of the action plan items were completed. Over the past year, the software has been expanded with the maintenance manager work order system. That included integration of the Town's GIS mapping with the assets within the citywide software. The benefit of this function is that roadways or areas can be selected on a map to assist with the prioritization of replacement through selection of condition and risk data for the surface and subsurface assets spatially. This is expected to assist with asset replacement and continued reconciliation between asset

management data and GIS data as well as available maintenance and inspection information.

Staff applied successfully for an Asset Management Planning Coordinator Intern through NOHFC. Recruitment of an intern proved unsuccessful within the timeframe of the program and under the requirements. We were able to hire a part time contract staff person to assist until December 13, 2024, within the available salary budget. Staffing resources have made advancement of the plan difficult. Throughout the demands of the regulatory changes, the need for a full-time Asset Management Coordinator resource has become more evident as data is in constant need of enhancement and updating. The hope is to allocate budget dollars towards a full-time resource in 2025 budget.

This next phase of enhancement to the asset management plan will involve public engagement to assess customer expectations and adjustment to proposed levels of service as required under the regulation.

The Town took advantage of AMP it up 3.0 offered through MFOA and funded by the Ministry of Infrastructure in the spring of 2024, by attending a workshop on the regulatory requirements which involve reporting current levels of service for all assets which we will be working towards in 2024 for non-core assets. This involves identifying services being provided for each asset category, determining the measures (customer/community levels and technical levels on the municipal side), gathering data from managers or work service area experts, and determining the lifecycle activities necessary to maintain the current level of service and their associated costs. The 2025 regulatory deadline will involve setting new level of service targets through stakeholder engagement and assessing the impact of those proposed levels of service through a new 10-year forecast.

#### Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends that Council approve the next two phases of the update and enhancement to the Asset Management Plan. This involves authorization of the start of

Phase 1, O.Reg 588/17 2024 Compliant Asset Management Plan and Phase 2, O.Reg 588/17 Proposed Levels of Service with the 10-year financial plan to support the lifecycle requirements to meet proposed levels of service targets for all asset categories.

The estimated duration of the entire project is 12-14 months, and the project is slightly delayed in getting underway due to staffing resources.

#### Advantages and/or Disadvantages of Staff Recommendation:

#### **Advantages**

- Reduces the chance of impacts to provincial and federal funding sources.
- Continuous improvement to the plan creates data for better decision making.
- Utilizing the same consultant, provider of the Town's asset management software, offers many benefits which include continued enhancement to capabilities of the software and data.

This is a large project requiring considerable staff and financial resources. In 2018, we

received a proposal to meet the July 1 2021 deadline for the project which totalled

\$194,550. By completing the Strategic Asset Management Policy ourselves and

completing the AMP it Up 2.0 Project, which provided us with an action plan and a gap

analysis, helping us to complete more of the tasks internally, we reduced that cost to

\$131,000 (plus HST). We were successful with a FCM grant, and the net cost was

further reduced to \$81,000 (plus HST) to meet the July 1st, 2021 deadline (\$113,550

cost savings). Once we complete the two phases recommended in this report, the

Town will meet all the regulatory requirements, with a total net cost of \$139,500.

To provide viable long-term options for dealing with the current substandard structure over Waubuno Road and to recommend that Council ask staff to further investigate the replacement of the structure with a new structure and to report back on specific design details.

Identify the Relationship to Council's Strategic Plan: Quality of Life - Economic Growth - Continue to invest in Infrastructure Improvements

#### **Background:**

The Town of Parry Sound like all municipalities has a significant amount of infrastructure to repair, maintain and eventually replace. The estimated cost of this work is significant and there is an ongoing challenge to identify the funding for the work that is required. Staff regularly re-assess and re-evaluate infrastructure when major work is required; i.e. is the infrastructure still required, are there alternatives, etc. The Waubuno bridge is an example where staff identified a piece of infrastructure that required a capital investment now and into the future and identified an option that had the least cost to the municipality, which was presented to Council and the public for consideration.

The most recent OSIM (Ontario Structural Inspection Manual) inspection has revealed several deficiencies, and the expected current repair cost is \$350,000 plus engineering to correct the current deficiencies and to extend the life of the structure. After the Council meeting in June, Council asked staff to obtain public input on the potential removal of the bridge.

The majority of the input from the Public indicated a desire to keep a bridge. There were varying suggestions including fixing the existing bridge, replacing the bridge with a new structure and a much lesser number expressing a desire to have the bridge removed.

A new structural inspection is required for 2024 (OSIM), which will provide updated information and expected costs. Given the time of year, the bridge inspection will need to proceed as any remedial work will not be possible in 2024.

Staff have identified four (4) options related to the bridge as follows:

#### Option 1– Repair existing structure.

The existing structure is made of wood and has undergone various repairs over the years. The structure is a combination of beams soaked in creosote and pressure treated wood. A number of the upright creosote posts have seriously decayed and sound hollow inside. Creosote is a toxic material that is not recommended for use with public infrastructure. The original estimated costs are expected to rise as buried portions of the structure are anticipated to be in very poor condition – current repair estimated Cost = \$350K

After the repairs are complete wooden portions remaining will continue to deteriorate, resulting in ongoing inspections and capital costs.

#### Option 2 - Replace existing bridge at current grade.

A replacement option has been researched that has estimated costs close to the required repairs for the existing bridge, but would reduce future costs by eliminating wood being in contact with soils etc. while providing a new structure that can be easily inspected in the future as required.

This option would continue to have substandard clearance under the bridge, would allow for a wider span underneath increasing vehicle/pedestrian safety under the bridge and reduce future capital repairs, refer to Attachment 1 sample bridge photos.

The proposed replacement bridge is modular in construction, ensuring minimal trail use disruption as the placement of the new structure can be done quite quickly while replacing the existing structure with resilient and environmentally responsible materials.

# Option 3 – Replace existing bridge with increased height clearance under the Bridge

There would be a marginal increase in cost over Option 3 above, but it would ensure that clearance height under the bridge can be maximized while having a minimal impact on the trail slope. The actual bridge would be the same as in Option 2, refer to Attachment 1 sample bridge photos. The existing bridge has a restricted clearance

height of 2.96m while the legal maximum height for vehicles in Ontario is 4.26m. Maximizing the clearance height would result in an overall height increase of the bridge deck platform of 1.3m

The existing bridge height restriction makes the area inaccessible to vehicles such as a standard delivery truck, municipal equipment such as a loader/backhoe, cement trucks and other specialized vehicles in addition to some emergency fire trucks.

Using local data sets, there are areas of the trail between Prospect St. and Bay St. (approx. 1000m) that reach a maximum slope of 7.3% and has an average slope of approximately 2.25% with a low elevation of 178.3m and a maximum elevation of 186.4m. Slopes as a result of increasing the height of the bridge must comply with applicable provincial accessibility requirements

There appears to be an opportunity to provide a raised clearance height while maintaining an acceptable grade on the trail. Similar to Option 2, future capital repairs would be reduced.

#### Option 4 – Remove the bridge

The least cost option is to remove the bridge. Removing the bridge also avoids the costs of future inspections and repairs. However, removal of the bridge would create an at grade crossing where the trail crosses Waubuno Road. The removal of the bridge regarding the slopes must comply with applicable provincial accessibility requirements.

Much of the public input indicates that an at-grade crossing is undesirable.

#### Conclusion

Should Council wish to maintain a bridge over Waubuno Road staff recommend Options 2 and 3 be further explored and a report be brought back to Council prior to any work being undertaken.

Advantages and/or Disadvantages of Staff Recommendation:

• Replacement of the structure ensures continued grade separated crossing of

Waubuno Road.

## **Background:**

There are currently 3 exits off Hwy 400 into the Town of Parry Sound, Bowes Street, Parry Sound Drive near Mill Lake and Parry Sound Drive at Hwy 124. In consultation with staff, having 2 exits off Hwy 400 with the same street can be confusing to visitors to the area and for emergency response.

Attachment 1 is a map showing both sections of Parry Sound Drive, one section highlighted in green and the other highlighted in red. The section of Parry Sound Drive that is recommended for renaming is highlighted in red, and runs from the intersection of Joseph St., Mall Drive and Parry Sound Drive to Hwy 400. It's timely to rename this section as there are no municipal addresses that would have to be changed.

This section of Parry Sound Drive is an exit off Hwy 400 with significant exposure to all traffic travelling north and south on Hwy 400 and creates a unique opportunity for the business community. Staff believe there is a commercial value associated with the

renaming and view the renaming is as an opportunity to raise funds for the new recreation and cultural centre. The objective is to complete the renaming prior to the end of the current fund-raising campaign for the Recreation Centre where funds raised up to \$100,000 are matched.

Staff have contacted MTO and they have advised the cost to change the signs would be the responsibility of the Town, therefore funds donated would be net of the cost to replacing the signs. Staff are working with MTO to estimate that cost.

It's recommended that an RFP be issued to solicit bids for the renaming of that section of Parry Sound Drive. The RFP would include information such as the following:

- highlight that net proceeds will be donated to the new Recreation and Cultural Centre;
- reference the exposure and visibility of signage on Hwy 400;
- request bidders to provide a preferred name and at least one alternate name;
- a minimum starting bid of \$45,000;
- when the funds are payable;
- reference that the responsibility of changing the signs rests with the MTO and the timeframe is uncertain;
- how the winning bid will be determined;
- the process for vetting names, including checking for duplicate names or names similar to an existing name, and advising First Nation communities of the name change;
- the closing date for bids.

Should there be a reason to not proceed with the name change Council has the option to cancel and not award the RFP.

## Advantages and/or Disadvantages of Staff Recommendation:

The renaming reduces confusion for those visiting the area and for emergency response vehicles.

The name change creates an opportunity to raise funds for a very worthwhile cause.

#### **Alternatives:**

1. The Town renames the section of Parry Sound Drive without using the opportunity as a fundraiser.

2. Don't rename that section of the road.

## **Cost/Financial Impact:**

The Town will be responsible for the cost of updating the signs. The funds donated to the new recreation and cultural centre will be net of any costs.

Dear Mayor, Council & Staff:

The Parry Sound Community Radio Association (PSCRA) continues with its efforts to establish FM Community Radio in our area. The Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) announcement late spring of last year imposing a two-year moratorium (effective immediately) on new radio applications caught many in the industry by surprise. Not to be discouraged, the PSCRA has been taking advantage of this time to compile a more thorough and detailed application. We are hopeful the CRTC will accept our submission prior to the end of the moratorium with hopes that it may consider special conditions or circumstances and begin the process, or at the least, place our entry into queue for processing as soon as possible.

Adding to the strength of the Association's application, it has garnered written endorsements from our MP, MPP, municipal leaders, business, support agencies, service organizations and local health care. We have identified a frequency, established a broadcast pattern, completed a market analysis and a proposed program schedule, also a capital cost budget and seven-year business plan have been drafted.

While we received a verbal "go ahead" from Mike Kearns, Public Works Director last year, our engineer is ready and available now to begin the next phase of his work which is to prepare an engineering brief which must be filed with the Innovation, Science and Economic Development Canada (ISED) {formally Industry Canada}. This step must precede our submission to the CRTC. Our engineer is available now to prepare this brief before moving on to other projects. He has stated that he can not proceed without written permission from The Town of Parry Sound to utilize the Bowes Street Water Tower site.
